THE APPLICATION ROUTE

The application route, known as Wick Lane is shown on the plan below:

Point A: OS Grid Reference: SU 891 237 junction with A286 (County Road)

to

Point B: OS Grid Reference SU 894 239 junction with restricted byway 3333 (south of path)

to

Point C: OS Grid Reference SU 895 238 junction with restricted byway 3333 (north of path)

to

Point D: OS Grid Reference SU 900 235 junction with footpaths 1118_1 and 1119

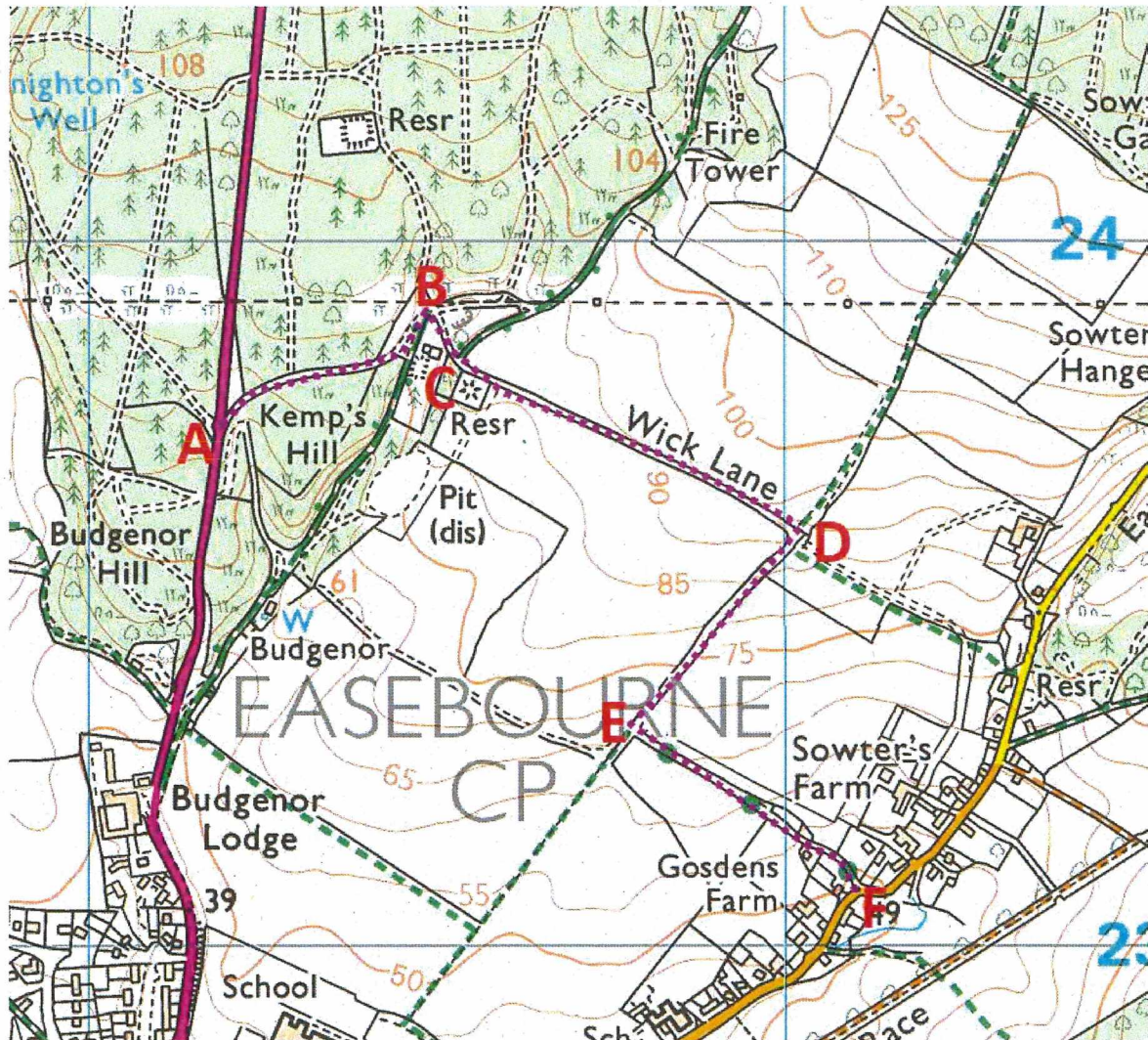
to

Point E: OS Grid Reference SU 897 233 junction with footpaths 1118_2

to

Point F: OS Grid Reference SU 901 230 junction with Easebourne Street (county road)

N.B. The application route is recorded on the list of streets as a publicly maintainable highway USRN 7201738 Wick Lane but does not have the physical appearance of a street for much of its length.
