- There is a lower proportion of residents in West Sussex with no qualifications than for Great Britain but higher than the South East.
- There is a large difference in the proportion of people with no qualifications across the districts. Crawley has the highest percentage of people with no qualifications. The proportion is also higher than the West Sussex average in Arun. Horsham and Mid Sussex have the lowest proportion of people with no qualifications in West Sussex.
