- The service sectors predominate, with a greater proportion of employees in West Sussex employed in the transport and communications sector due to the presence of Gatwick Airport. As expected, this difference is most significant in Crawley.
- Adur and Horsham have a higher proportion of employees in manufacturing jobs than the county average or the South East or national average.
- Arun, Chichester and Worthing have a higher proportion of jobs in the public sector.

Note: This Table does not include the agriculture or energy sectors as the numbers at local level are very small.
