Call Grades</i></p> <p><i>2.1 There are four types of call grades:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Emergency - Immediate police attendance (Grade 1 – Target time is a maximum of 15 minutes);</i> • <i>Priority - Earliest possible police attendance (Grade 2 – Target time is a maximum of 1 hour);</i> • <i>Scheduled - Planned police response (Grade 3 – by appointment either at a Police Station or by a Police Constable or Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) attending at an agreed time; and</i> • <i>Resolution without Deployment - No further police action, information only or duplicate call or a police generated activity which does not require the controller to actively seek a unit for deployment (Grade 4).</i> <p>The full policy can be viewed through the following link: https://sussex.police.uk/media/5753/785-pp.pdf</p> <p>COMPLETED.</p>	Call Grading	No. of calls received	% of calls received	Grade 1	63,612	12%	Grade 2	52,020	10%	Grade 3	67,927	12%	Grade 4	195,929	36%	Ungraded	164,769	30%	Total	544,257	100%
