The Commissioner's Annual Report and Financial Outturn Report 2021/22</p>	<p>2) The PCC offered to provide Cllr Whippy with more information on the Force's approach to rehabilitating and educating vulnerable children and children with learning difficulties removed from disrupted County Lines activity to ensure that they do not re-offend.</p>	<p>OSPCC</p>	<p>Sussex Police have confirmed the following in respect the information requested about operational policy and procedure around rehabilitating vulnerable children and young people:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • any offenders who are children and young people will be referred to the Youth Offending Team for a disposal decision and/or [possible] court diversionary, educational or intervention activity. • should the Crown Prosecution Service authorise a charge against a juvenile offender then, assuming they are found guilty, this offender would be subject to the disposal conditions set by the court, including further options for education and rehabilitation.

			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> should a juvenile be recognised to be a victim during an investigation, they will be released from the investigation and a new crime recorded which details their potential exploitation and/or trafficking. This will result in a standard investigation, with the juvenile recorded as a victim, and safeguarding considerations used to form part of the investigation. The National Referral Mechanism will also be instigated at this stage and provides statutory responsibilities for the police and partner agencies in respect of safeguarding arrangements. These are set by national protocols and are not bespoke to Sussex. <p style="text-align: right;">COMPLETED.</p>
