New terms of reference for the Corporate Parenting Panel are proposed in order to deliver a more outward-focused Panel and to ensure that the voice of the child is central to all its work. It is recommended that new terms of reference be agreed by the County Council as soon as possible, to ensure the best outcomes are being achieved for children looked after and care leavers in West Sussex at the earliest opportunity.

The key change is the proposal to widen the membership to become a multi-agency advisory panel, with members including a representative of Independent Reviewing Officers, a Foster Carer, Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the West Sussex Foster Carer Association, a member of the Children in Care Council and a Care Leaver. These changes will be reviewed in six months and during this time it is proposed that there is consultation with the Children in Care Council to seek its views on how the Panel operates.

The Director of Law and Assurance has therefore used his powers under Standing Order 3.45, in consultation with the Chairman of the Governance Committee, to endorse new terms of reference and membership of the Corporate Parenting Panel for recommendation to the County Council on 5 April 2019.

## South Chichester County Local Committee

**The Witterings** SC13(18/19) [West Wittering - Chapel Lane, Acre Street and Piggery Hall Lane - Experimental Traffic Regulation Order](#)

The County Council has been approached by West Wittering Estate (WWE) for assistance in managing the traffic flow to and from the West Wittering Beach car park. The demand for access to the beach has always been high and, with the improvement of satellite navigation systems (Sat Navs) and advanced mapping, traffic is navigating its way to the coast, diverting from the main access roads and using narrower single track roads that are unsuitable for high volumes of traffic. As a result of the issues, WWE has brought forward plans to better manage peak traffic flow in West Wittering, which would need to be provided on the publicly maintainable highway. Consequently the Highway Authority's permission is required to make the appropriate Traffic Regulation Order.

The Director of Law and Assurance, in consultation with the Chairman of the South Chichester County Local Committee and the Chairman of the Performance and Finance Select Committee, has used his delegated powers under Standing Order 3.45 to make and advertise the Experimental Traffic Regulation Orders outlined in the report for a maximum period of 18 months. The urgency of this matter was due to the fact that officers would like to be able to implement the proposals before the next County Local Committee meeting.

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### Highways and Infrastructure

The proposed decision on the A29 Realignment Scheme (HI20(18/19) refers) was called in for scrutiny by the Environment, Communities and Fire Select Committee. The call-in was heard at a meeting of the Committee on 14 March 2019. The Committee resolved that it:

- Supports, in principle, the need for the A29 Realignment Scheme;
- Calls on the Cabinet Member for Highways and Infrastructure to withdraw this decision and reconsider it in light of the concerns expressed by members at the meeting, and that any further decision which commits the County Council to any course of action relating to this is not published until after the current public consultation takes place, in which all contributions are given close consideration; and
- Agrees for the Business Planning Group to look into the current process surrounding the initial costing of major projects.

The Cabinet Member responded to the resolutions on 22 March 2019 and made the following comments on the Select Committee's recommendations.

The scheme will help to deliver the West Sussex Transport Plan and the recently adopted Arun Local Plan which has established the principle of strategic development in the area and the A29 Realignment as part of the supporting infrastructure package. By providing improved infrastructure to support the economy, the Cabinet Member considers that the scheme will also help to deliver the West Sussex Plan which is the County Council's commitment to its residents. Therefore, it is now up to the County Council to deliver the A29 Realignment to support the delivery of development and meet the needs of current and future residents.

The Cabinet Member said that, from the information given by officers, it was clear that withdrawing the decision would result in delays to the delivery programme. This is a major infrastructure project with multiple funding partners and dependencies, so delaying the delivery programme would incur potential legal, financial and reputational risks. Although the Cabinet Member acknowledged the level of local concern that exists about the scheme that was reflected in the Committee debate and recommendations, he also noted that the Committee supported, in principle, the need for the scheme. Therefore, he considered that the decision should not be withdrawn as to do so would delay the delivery programme and could jeopardise delivery of the scheme.

However, in response to the Committee's recommendations, the Cabinet Member has confirmed that comments received during the consultation will be taken into account before the scheme design is finalised. He will also ensure that procurement of a design and build contractor should only take place provided that no substantive changes are required to the scheme. He hoped that these assurances will demonstrate to the Committee that the feedback received during the public consultation will be given due consideration as the scheme develops.
