Woodlands Meed School in Burgess Hill, West Sussex opened in September 2012 with the aim of building a new single-site special school for 4-19-year-olds when two special schools at Court Meadow and Newick House closed. However, plans for a college are being threatened by a decision to give the land promised for the new buildings to an academy chain due to take over the neighbouring Oakmeeds Community College. As it now stands, there are no current plans to complete the school and there is not enough room at the former Newick House site to accommodate the students now at the school building and they are being forced to make heartbreaking decisions to turn students away from their friends and the staff they know at 14 years old, because the Newick House site does not have the facilities to meet their needs. You can find the list of schemes that are being progressed and the Community Issues List in the December Chanctonbury CLC papers using the link below: http://www2.westsussex.gov.uk/ds/clc/cby/cby041213age.pdf I have informed Cllr David Barling of your concerns about fast moving traffic on the roads surrounding the school and the limited number of pedestrian crossing facilities. Where a local request has Cllr support then it can be included on the Community Issues List for the Chanctonbury CLC area. It is important to note that this is not a commitment for the scheme to be delivered by the County Council, only the schemes picked out as priorities are delivered by the County Council. Inclusion on the list is a commitment for the County to support the development of a scheme through a number of routes, for example in partnership with the local parish or community group. The Chanctonbury Community Issues List currently contains a proposal for a safe route to school scheme for Shooting Field associated with the Primary and Grammar Schools. Cllr Barling is in support of</p>

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				<p>this proposal and the County Council will support delivery of a safe routes to school scheme. I met with a representative from the School, the governors and the Parish Council in September last year to review the proposals for a safe routes to school project in the area, a number of points were raised by the school for improvements for pedestrian access. We spoke about the possibility of local fundraising to help deliver some of the improvements in line with an updated school travel plan and the need for both schools to take a joint approach towards controlling the level of car parking available to encourage sustainable travel. The school were also going to gather more information on the preferred locations for pedestrian crossing facilities so that the County Council can assess the possibilities for provision. At the meeting we also discussed the need to demonstrate local support for the proposal for a 20mph speed limit by engaging with other local residents and Steyning Parish Council, as any proposals for reduced speed limits will need to have a large level of local support before a scheme would be progressed. I have requested that a speed survey is undertaken along Shooting Field to assess the current speed of traffic in the area, this will be programmed for some time in the next few months. Depending on current traffic speeds, the introduction of 20mph limits may need supporting traffic calming measures to bring traffic speeds down, vertical traffic calming features (such as speed bumps) can be unpopular with local residents and road users as they can create unwanted noise and</p>

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				<p>vibrations and reduce the level of parking available in a road. Cllr. Barling has not indicated his support for such measures at this time, you may wish to discuss this with him if the survey shows average speeds are above 24mph. The County takes road safety very seriously and constantly reviews accident data to focus our work. Having reviewed the road traffic collision data for the area Shooting Field would not be considered as having a road safety issue. Whilst your petition did not receive the necessary numbers to trigger a debate at the HOSC, we did pick up on this issue through the HOSC Business Planning Group (which carries out preliminary examination of issues referred to HOSC) and through the South East Coast regional health scrutiny network. The regional network (made up of the HOSC Chairmen for Kent, Surrey, Medway, Brighton & Hove, East Sussex and West Sussex) raised changes to gluten-free prescribing with the Chief Executive and Chairman of the Strategic Health Authority in April this year. Then in May, our Business Planning Group discussed this issue with representatives of NHS West Sussex (the PCT) and the two Clinical Commissioning Groups for West Sussex. We learned from these discussions that there had been decisions taken by some PCTs across the region to limit the prescribing of gluten-free foods for coeliac patients. We were assured that PCTs discussed this with the Coeliac Society before implementing the change in prescribing policy. However, NHS West Sussex confirmed that no final decision has been taken within West Sussex on this issue. Of the two Clinical Commissioning Groups, Coastal West Sussex Federation confirmed its interim position that</p>

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				prescribers adhere to the Coeliac UK guidelines, and the North West Sussex GP Commissioning Association informed us that it is considering its position but has as yet made no change to its gluten-free prescribing. The Business Planning Group last met on 5th October, and was assured that there had been no change in these circumstances.
