Arrangements were made for the O.P. to be manned during the hours of darkness, + the HQ reported with a considerable + prolonged AA fire to the N.E., + a recurring light somewhere near the Bypass to the S.W. of the County Hall. By about 20.30 the route to Chichester was clear and remained so until 01.44 when the main road was sounded in air raid. By 02.00 the County was clear of reds but in the meantime Chichester had gone purple. About midnight a conflagration was observed from the O.P. to the North East of Chichester. On enquiry of the Chichester Report Centre it was ascertained that a number of incendiary bombs had fallen on Molecomb. The fires were quickly extinguished by the Chichester F.B. there were no casualties.
