5 am. Arouned early in the morning by a heavy bomberdment. We received orders from the Brigade to be ready to move at the abortest notice. The Battalion got up dressed and had breakfast. We move however was made. It transpired that the enemy were expecting us to deliver an attack and so bomberded our fire a support treaches in the RICHESUURC LAVOUR Sector. They also bomberded LACOUTURE where the Comeron Mighlanders were billeted, cameing some casualties.

Marched to ALLOVAGES at 1.50 pm. Capt V.R.C.Deshwood evacuated with measles.

Received orders to move up to LES FACURS: marched off R p.m and reached LES FACURS at 6.30 pm, & went into billete for the night.

Received orders for an assault on the derman Lines opposite RICHESUUM L'AVOUE to take place on the morning of the Sthe Remained in LES FACTHS making necessary arrangements for the next day. 7 pm just as we kun were moving off to RICHESUUM received orders that the attack had been postponed 24 hours and we were to remain where we were for that night.

LES FACORS - RICHEBOURG L'AVOUR

Remained at LES FACOSS all day and moved up to RICEESSUES L'AVOUS in the evening. On arrival took over breastworks from BLACK LATCH.

During the night bombs, wooden bridges were drawn for crossing the stream in front of our line. 5 Swappers (Otd) . (Bining Experts) Joined our two Companies which were going to lead the attack in order to out the wires of any mines

in German lines, when we had captured them. Capt Villiers & St Croix were

wounded in the EUR DU BOIS on the way up.

RICHEBOUNG L'AVOUR

9th

The day started with an issue of tea and rum at 3.30 am. Battalion limits with regard to onemys first line trenches, A.E to V.1. Frontage of Bn about 400 yards. En left on Cinder track. Bombardment commenced at 5 am. At this hour the Battalion

was distributed as follows:let Line of Breastworks - 2 °C Company left.
End Line of Breastworks - 'A' " right;
'B' Company, left.
(less 1 plateen 80 8)

No 8 Flatoon under End Lt F.T. Goring attached to Lowland Coy R. E. in breastworks immediately behind the MUE DU BOIS.

Machine Cuns were distributed as follows -2 on extreme left of Bn line. One of these guns remained in this position throughout. 2 guns about 100 yards to the left of En right.

Battn Head Quarters at telephone near right flank of Battalion, in front Breastwork. commenced and two plateons of 'C' & 'D' Coys respectively advanced over the parapet.

First line from right to left being formed by No 9 Platoon (End Lt Festrell)
11 Platoon (Sgt Beeves) 15 Platoon (End Lt Soborts) 18 Platoon (Sgt Dray), and were closely followed by the second line formed by 10 platoon (Sgt Startup) 18 platoon (End Lt Taylor) 18 platoons which advence over the parapet was made in line except by 15 and 13 platoons which afforded some cover.

At the same time, 'A' Coy advanced from second line of breastworks on the top of the ground, the two platoons in

(2nd Lt Talbot) at a distance of about 50 yards. A Coy's savance was in column of sections to a flank at deploying interval. Men 3 and 2 Flatoons left the rear breastwork, the outer platoons filed inwards behind the breastwork, thus getting into position behind the leading platoons before they advanced. Meanwhile. B Coys three plateons, advancing from the End line breastworks to the first line by the left. communication trouch having started two minutes before the advertised time two minutes before the advertised time (5 28 am) in order to allow of their reaching the first line at the same time as 'A' Company.

of these Companies, the whole of 'A' followed 'C' ever the breastworks, and two plateoms of 'B' Gof followed 'D' Goy. These were no 6 Flatoon (2nd Lt Miller) right and No 5 Platoon (2nd Lt Miller) left. No 7 Platoon (2nd Lt Wallington) being ordered to remain behind the front breastworks by 0 0 B Coy (Capt 0 B Bond) D 8 0 The Bachine Gun Officer had given orders for two Machine Guns to go forward with the leading Coys line, one from each flank, and the other two guns were to advance in a similar manner with the supporting Coye 2nd Line. Both guns were only to move if substantial progress was being unde.
The two right guns actually went forward, but the two left guns remained in their original position except that one of these was moved about 16 yards to the left front, to a listening post.
This gun was withdrawn to its original postion after firing for about a position after firing for about a quarter of an hour.

He of Platoon advancing with a section of Lowland Coy R.E. on the top of the ground reached the left portion of the first line breastworks just after No 7 Platoon. It appears that through some misunderstanding that an order was passed that the suppers should advance over the breastworks. Hany did so, being shortly afterwards recalled, but not before they had suffered seweral casualties. No 8 Platoon carried sand bags, barbed wire as for making good the onemy's position if taken.

Before our supporting Companies were elear of the first line breastworks, the 5th Bn RL Sussex Regt arrived, many of them going straight over the breastworks and becoming mingled with our men. the following arrangements had been made with remard to Bombers by 2nd Lt Austin, Comming to Company -Bombers of 14 & 15 latoons were to collect at VI when enemy's first line was reached with the intention to bomb the enemy out of the communication trench in rear. 'C' cop's bembers were distributed, one with each of sections. Sergt Startup having orders to supervise the work of these bombers as occasion offerred on arriving at enemy's first line. 'B' Coy's bombers were with their plateens except that these of No 8. (attached to R E) who were attached to E lateen (End Lt Miller). 'A' Coy's Bombers were grouped near their respective glaton Commanders. The leading Coys, 'C' & 'D' barried bridges and ladders. 'C' Coy 5 bridges and 2 ladders. 'D' Coy 6 bridges and 2 ladders. From information collected it appears that on the right Capt R F Finks '0' Ony was hit early in the action but continued to lead his men. The same is also reported of End Lt Taylor 'C' Coy who was leading 'C' Coy's End Line. End Lt Fewtrell, leading 'C' Coy's first line advanced to within about 47 yards of the enemy's wire. Capt Finch, Commig A Coy also reached this line. and It show was wounded whilst leading his platoon and was subsequently Killed whilst endeavours were being made to bring him back Lieut Dicker and End Lt Talbot were both wounded
The right of our line was subjected to
enfilede fire from Machine Guns,
On the left and it Austin 'B' Coy
appears to have been hit early in the
engagement leaving 2nd it Roberts in
command of 'P' Coy's first line 2nd it Roberts was sounded and Ind it Sind Lt Roberts was wounded and Ind Lt Child in command of 'D' Coy's End line was Killed. Coy Sgt Majer Butcher assumed command and ordered the first line to dig themselves in.

of 'B' Ooy, and it miller a 2 it Jucks were both hit. The left suffered very severely from enfilade fire from an angle in the Serman treach opposite the Munster Pausiliers, the early retirement of this En leaving our left flank in the air. In general the centre of gravity of the assaulting troops did not get much more than 150 yards, or about half way to the Serman Breastworks, though a portion succeeded in getting within about 40 yards of it, and one man appears to have reached the parapet itself

Plags were carried to denote the position of Companies. The German fired from loopholes low down in the parapet.

At 6.30 a.m orders were given to withdraw behind our first breastworks, under cover of respected behardment. D Coy's first line seems to have received this order, but not 'C' Coy's. Several men managed to get back during the day but some remained till dark, a few joining in the assault by the lat attracts Brigade delivered in the afternoon.

The two machine gune on the right were got back and three out of the four machine gune and what remained of the Battalion were returned to a line of broastworks behind the RUS DU BOIS, the fourth Machine Cun by request remained up in the first line till late in the afternoon. Our casuaties were

Our casualties were due to Machine Gun Fire Shrapael and High Explosive Shells when advancing over the first breastwork and between our line. at 4 pm a fresh ascault was delivered by the Black Watch and Cameron Highlanders (lat Guards Bed) after another bembarament. This attack reached the enemy's first line but was intrem out soon afterwards. In the evening about 7.30 pm the Battalion marched back to billets at 18 8 CHOQUAUX.
