ASHURST WOOD WAR MEMORIAL. 1914-1918.

W. Armstrong

1901 Census shows William Armstrong, aged 7, living with parents George & Alice Armstrong at 20, Lingfield Road, East Grinstead.

1911 census shows William George Armstrong, aged 17, living with mother, Alice Elizabeth Armstrong, living at 45 Lingfield Road, East Grinstead.

1912 William enlists at Woolwich into Royal Regiment of Artillery. (RH & RFA). Service number 67054.

Served with BEF in France. Was wounded by Gas.

28/07/1917. He deserted and was sentenced to death. This was later commuted to 10 Years custody.

27/02/1920. Discharged from army.

No reason for this man to be listed on the memorial. No other W. Armstrong found during research from East Grinstead/Ashurst Wood area. Ongoing.




