1945

May 10th (Cousin) Nevill is home again after five years as a POW......Some of the British POWs came into the YMCA canteen tonight - they are from the camp at Sompting, which is the largest of its kind in the country. Over a thousand servicemen a day are repatriated and the time elapsing between their entry and re-joining their families is less than two days. They can then spend fifty-six days with their families before reporting back to their regiment, ship or squadron.
