European refugees must leave coastal area

**ALL GERMANS  
AND AUSTRIANS  
MUST LEAVE  
WORTHING**

Austrians and Germans in the Worthing district who were originally registered as "refugees from Nazi oppression" have been given three days' notice to leave the 20-mile coastal protected area.

Some of them left Worthing yesterday. Others who have not yet received their notices will leave in a few days' time.

Many of them will be made homeless, but arrangements are being made in London to give them board and lodging until they can find new homes in un-protected areas.

Over 120 were affected in Worthing by the new Order. Eighty of these are domestic servants. Most of them are registered with the Worthing Refugee Committee, which will now have to close its hostels, opened originally to house refugees.

All of them were given complete exemption by Alien Tribunals.
