A very exhaustive and interesting report is now given of the Pulborough and District War Emergency Committee to December 31, 1914. At that date a most generous response of £276 14s. was made to the committee's appeal for funds, and an additional £17 has since been subscribed. Of the former sum there had been subscribed, in round figures, £109 to the Prince of Wales' Fund, £45 to Needlework Fund, £47 to Belgian Refugees' Fund, £19 to Christmas Presents Fund, and £56 to General Fund. A lot of other personal good works, too numerous to mention in this limited space, have been and are being done of which the Pulborough district may well be proud.
