VOLUNTEERS URGENTLY NEEDED—ENROL TO-DAY.
HELP TO SAFEGUARD BRITAIN'S FOOD SUPPLY.

REGULAR FORCE.

More Volunteers are urgently needed to meet the growing demand for members of the Women's Land Army.

Nearly 6,000 are already working in all parts of the country, but many more are wanted for all branches of farm work, including:—

Dairy Work.	Market Gardening.
General Farming.	Forestry.
Tractor Driving.	Timber Measuring.
Poultry Work.	Fruit Farming.

**Will YOU help your Country
to grow more Food?**

Volunteers receive a month's training previous to employment, and are supplied with a Land Army outfit of breeches, pullover, boots, shoes, mackintosh, dungarees, stockings, hat and overall coat. Rail fares are paid to the place of training and first place of employment, and Volunteers receive from their employing farmer a guaranteed minimum weekly wage.

AUXILIARY FORCE.

Volunteers are also needed for periods of 4 weeks or more to undertake Short-term Seasonal work.
