Note: All the above items are from the Worthing Museum and Art Gallery collections. Some of these, along with other souvenirs, as well as early bathing costumes, can be seen on display at the Museum.

Although the design and decoration of the objects may have changed, these 19th and 20th century souvenirs include items similar to those found as seaside souvenirs today: china mugs, jugs, plates and ornaments; drinking glasses; and small useful objects such as a needle-case and a glasses-case. Then, as now, these souvenirs are usually decorated with a picture of either a map or a scene from the resort.

Source 1

A selection of Worthing souvenir porcelain, hand-painted and transfer-printed, late 19th century, early 20th century.

Source 2 and 4

These are examples of Mauchline box-ware, small wooden items that were made in the small Scottish town of Mauchline from c1830 to c1930, and were extremely popular with Victorian and Edwardian travellers.

Source 3

A ceramic circular box, c1845. The lid has an over-glazed transfer of a view of South Street, Worthing.

Source 5

A porcelain vase, early 20th century, decorated with a coloured transfer map of Worthing and district.

Source 6

A white plate with printed map of Sussex including historical sites, late 20th century.

Source 7

A coloured glass tumbler with the outer surface frosted and decorated with a colour transfer of the beach, Worthing. By P. Jost, 1930s.

Source 8

A white porcelain souvenir jug with a printed image of a seaside scene at Worthing, late 19th century.

Source 9

A stoneware candlestick in column form, painted in lustrous pink with a large oval panel containing a black print of the pier, Worthing, c1860-1900.

Source 10

A selection of Worthing souvenir porcelain, including a china cat bearing the Worthing Crest transfer printed, made in Czechoslovakia; a china shoe with transferprinted Worthing view; and candlestick. Late 19th century, early 20th century.

Sources 11 and 12

It's interesting to compare the design, material and decoration of these two souvenir mugs, one from the late 19th and one from the late 20th century.
