THE WOMEN AT WORK, - The Haywards Heath Branch of the Central Sussex Women's Suffrage Society has decided to suspend its ordinary suffrage work for the present, in order to devote its energies to relief work at this crisis in our national affairs. The members, as an organised body of women, offered their services to the local Relief Committee by letter at its first meeting. It has, however, been decided that a Women's Committee representing all the Women's Organisations in Haywards Heath and Wivelsfield, would be able to accomplish better results than could be obtained by Suffragists working alone. We are glad to be able to state that such a Committee has been formed to work in conjunction with the War Fund Committee. In addition to their offer of personal help, a collection in aid of the local War Fund has been made by the Haywards Heath members of the Society, and the sum of £5 5s. 11d. has been handed in to the Treasurer, Mr. C. H. S. Ellis.
