**SUSSEX MEN AT  
ROEHAMPTON.**

Writing to Miss Drayton, of Drayton House, Chichester, from Queen Mary's Hospital, Roehampton, Corp. J. H. Lee (late of Bosham), of the Royal Sussex Regiment, says:—Just a line to say I've got up to Roehampton at last to be fitted with my artificial limb, so I hope you will excuse me for writing to you, but it's to thank you and all the people who have subscribed together to get the hospital up as they have done. It's well fitted out, and I think everyone should write and thank you all for your trouble. We are well cared for, and if everything goes on alright, as I am now, I shall be back again about the end of July. The limbs that are made for us are splendid. The legs are rather better than the arms. After you get your limb they keep us here about 10 to 14 days, and by that time you wouldn't hardly tell a man has an artificial leg. It's wonderful how they are made. I get measured for mine this afternoon or to-morrow. There are about nine of us in here from the Royal Sussex, and they all wish me to thank you and all for your trouble. We have 540 patients in this hospital now, so they are very busy making limbs. So now I must close."
