NOTICE.

INCREASE OF FOOD SUPPLIES.

ACTING under the above-named Order the
Horsham Urban District Council are
taking steps to secure the cultivation of all
unoccupied land within their district, with
the object of increasing the food supplies of
the country. Before proceeding to take any
land for the purpose named the Council desire
to ascertain what labour for such cultivation
is likely to be available; and they invite
applications from persons who are willing to
undertake the cultivation of land which can
be procured under the Order. In order that no
time may be lost in putting into operation the
powers conferred by the Order, applications
must be delivered to the undersigned not later
than Saturday, the 20th of January instant.

Forms of Application for an allotment
(which will be ten rods of land, or thereabout,
and the proposed Regulations to be observed
by tenants, can be obtained of the undersigned.

SEED POTATOES.

The Council have been requested by the
County War Agricultural Committee to send
in a return as to the probable extent of the
demand for seed potatoes from cottagers and
holders of allotments in the Urban area. Any
small cultivator desirous of taking advantage
of the opportunity to secure seed potatoes at
cost price through the War Agricultural Com-
mittee is requested to send particulars of his
or her requirements to the undersigned not
later than Saturday, the 20th of January
instant.
