





TENDENCY TO DRAW THE LINE MORE CLOSELY.

E have almost reached the end of the task we undertook when we decided to appeal to the generosity of our readers to assist us in sending tobacco and eigarettes to our soldiers at the Front. The movement has been so generously supported that we have been able to raise the magnificent sum of £500 for the purpose; but we have now decided to close the Fund on the last day of the present month, and we shall be glad if those who wish to contribute will do so with as little delay as possible.
