#### Welcome Gifts For the Royal Sussex Regiment Abroad.

#### How Our Readers May Assist Us.

THE Proprietors of the GAZETTE have much pleasure in announcing that they have been able to make arrangements by which, with the kindly co-operation of their thousands of readers, they will be able to send a supply of tobacco and cigarettes to the Royal Sussex Regiment now on active service on the Continent. That such an arrangement will prove acceptable to the gallant soldiers in whose interest it is devised we have not the least doubt, for it will serve to remind them, in the midst of the terrible conflict in which they are engaged, that their own kindred bear them in the kindest recollection.

**The Fund Now Open!**

This notification may therefore be accepted, that "The Worthing Gazette Tobacco Fund" is duly inaugurated, and we invite assistance in two directions.

We want, in the first place, all who are disposed to give practical proof of their sympathy to send us their sixpences, even if it be only one, or as many more as their means will allow; and we also desire the kindly co-operation of the ladies, who are occupying themselves so usefully in various directions, to undertake to collect money for the purpose. Printed cards will be supplied to them on application at our CHATSWORTH-ROAD OFFICES.

Every sixpence so contributed will purchase a special parcel consisting of a cake of dark tobacco, a cake of light tobacco, and a packet containing ten cigarettes. The approximate net weight of each packet will be a quarter of a pound, and in ordinary circumstances each of them would cost eighteen pence.

**How The Scheme Will Work.**

We have entered into arrangement with Messrs. Martins, Limited, the well-known and enterprising firm of tobacconists and cigar shippers, of 210, Piccadilly, to dispatch the packages to the Front, to the Royal Sussex Regiment. The name and address of the person who contributes the sixpence will be written on the wrapper of each parcel, and there will be an intimation of the medium through which the welcome gift is sent.

The Proprietors of the GAZETTE are conscious of the number of demands already being made upon the generosity of the public, but this is a direction in which everyone can help without any real self-sacrifice; and in our next issue we hope to be able to announce that

**Many Hundreds of Sixpences** have been sent to us, and that a corresponding number of packages of tobacco are already on their way to those gallant fellows, serving under the banner of the Royal Sussex Regiment, who are so valiantly fighting their country's battles, in order that we who remain may continue to dwell in comfort and security.

WE have almost reached the end of the task we undertook when we decided to appeal to the generosity of our readers to assist us in sending tobacco and cigarettes to our soldiers at the Front.
