The CWG cares for cemeteries and memorials at 23,000 locations, in 153 countries. The CWG casualty database lists the names and place of commemoration of the 1.7 million men and women of the Commonwealth forces who died during the two world wars. It is possible to search by surname, date, war, rank, regiment, awards or any combination of those criteria.

Redoubt fortress and Military Museum - Eastbourne

Military Museum of Sussex housed in the Redoubt Fortress is the largest and most comprehensive of its kind in the South of England. West Sussex Record Office - Chichester

The Royal Sussex Regiment archives deposited in the West Sussex Record Office since 1979 consist of documents, photographs, audio-visual records and printed works. These cover the history of the Regiment from its establishment in 1701 as the 35th Regiment of Foot to its amalgamation in The Queen's Regiment in 1966. To date the collection comprises some 200 boxes of documents, 40,000 photographs, 1,250 printed books and 50 films.
