

SORTED!

A multi-million pound flagship project that will revolutionise the way our recycled rubbish is handled is about to open at Ford Airfield, near Arundel, as West Sussex Connections went to press.

Called a Material Recycling Facility (MRF), the plant, which sorts the different products that we pop into our kerbside recycling bins, is one of the most advanced in the UK.

The MRF will be operated by Viridor on behalf of the County Council and will sort about 100,000 tonnes of mixed recyclable materials collected from all West Sussex households a year.

This means you can put all your dry and clean recyclables – glass, paper, card, cans and foil – in one bin. Check with your district or borough council for details of what can be collected in your area.

You can do your bit by making sure you put everything that can be recycled in the recycling bin and NOT in the black sack rubbish.

By recycling more and more we will send less and less to landfill dumps which are fast filling up and are no longer a sustainable way of dealing with our household waste.



Blazing Saddles!

Biker firefighters from our Fire and Rescue Service are stepping up their drive to reduce motorcycle accidents and promote safer riding techniques.

County Council Leader Henry Smith said: "This new centre has massive environmental benefits

and will really help to reduce the amount we have to pay on landfill taxes, which will reduce the pressure on Council Tax. The state-of-the-art centre will create jobs and dramatically cut the amount of miles our recycled rubbish travels once it leaves our doorstep collection bins.

"In the past, recyclable items, including bottles, plastic,

card, paper and cans were shipped out to other sorting centres around the UK. Now it will all be sorted at Ford, before being sent to companies who will transform items such as plastic bottles into clothes and glass into road surfaces and water filters! The centre will use the latest recycling technology to sort different types of

materials quickly, efficiently and to high quality standards."

There is also a dedicated education room and viewing platform designed to show and educate the public about what happens at an MRF. From September schoolchildren will be able to get first-hand experience of the centre. For more

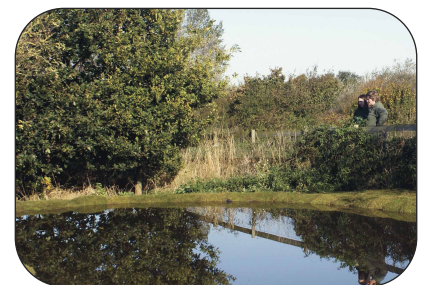

Max Hood, County Fire Officer, said:

"We are always geared to responding to emergencies, but a main feature of the plan is helping people understand the inherent danger of fire in the home and at work and the dangers when out driving.

"This means we will continue to carry out a considerable amount of both educational and practical work to prevent such incidents occurring in the first place."

The plans are on the Fire and Rescue Service's page on our website. Copies are also available in your local Library and District and Borough Council offices. The consultation runs from 27 July to 19 October.



Home from Home

A pioneering scheme called Homeshare, which helps older people stay in their own homes while giving key workers and other professionals a place to live, is growing.

A householder offers free accommodation in exchange for an agreed level of help. This help can involve a host of tasks from cooking and cleaning through to gardening and other housework.

Homesharers come from a wide age range and a variety of backgrounds. The scheme means they are able to save money because they are not paying rent while continuing their normal working life.

Interviews and checks are made before the two sides are introduced to each other and a match is made. Any responsible adult who needs somewhere to live can be considered to take part.

"We have had some great successes," said Dawn Blake, Homeshare Co-ordinator. "One lady had stopped going out because of depression. But since having a homesharer living with her she has found the companionship has given her a new lease of life. She is even planning a party!"

Help to change local lives for the better

Over 60 people have been recruited to social work positions in West Sussex since the start of the No Limits campaign in October. Could you join them?

The www.nolimitsatwestsussex.co.uk website was created to raise awareness of social work in the county.

It features current vacancies and videos of West Sussex social workers talking about their job.

Since the launch, 65 people have been recruited into social work positions and another 20 are now fully qualified social workers having completed their training, sponsored by the County Council.

The campaign is now developing a return to social work course, due to start later this year. The three-day course will be for former social workers to brush up on their training, with a guaranteed job interview at the end.

Full details of the course will be available on the No Limits website later in the year.

Paul Engelmann, pictured right, who was appointed after learning about the campaign, is now a social worker for the Intensive Family Support Team in Worthing, working to support families in need.

Many of the families Paul works with have children with child protection issues and one of his priorities is to ensure that plans are in place for the children to remain safe.

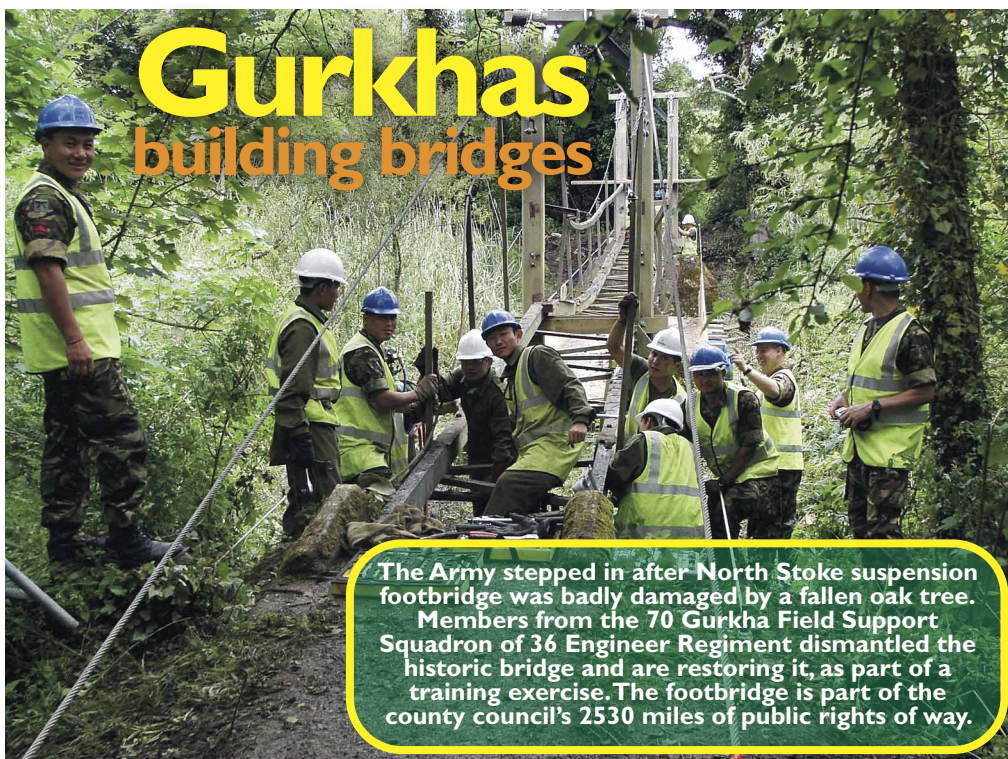
Before moving to West Sussex, Paul was a social worker in Edinburgh for two years.

He wanted to move to Worthing to be near his girlfriend and family. He saw the No Limits campaign on the internet and decided to apply for a job.

Paul said: "It's really rewarding working with families when you can help to support parents to bring about changes in their lives and in their child's life."

"I think social work is a great career. You meet some amazing people, both as clients and professionals. It can be very stressful and you need to know how to manage that, but it's also a job that you won't get bored doing and you learn something new everyday."

He added: "After seeing the No Limits website I completed an application form and later heard I had secured an interview. I found the whole process very straightforward."

They could all become foster carers

Foster carers come from all parts of the community and their backgrounds are as varied as their life experiences.

What they all have in common is the wish and the ability to give a child a caring home. They also have the essential qualities you need to be a carer such as patience, tolerance, flexibility, and the necessary energy to look after children and young people.

You can apply to foster whether or not:

- you are single, married or divorced
- you have a disability
- you are gay or lesbian
- you are of any race or religion
- you work or are unemployed
- you rent or own your home
- you already have children.

Far more important than your background, your race, your religion or your life experience

is that you have the time and space in your life to care for a child. You will also be willing to undergo the preparation and training needed before you can become a foster carer.

The task of fostering can at times be difficult and challenging. However, most foster carers say it is one of the most rewarding and satisfying experiences of their lives to see a young person grow, develop and achieve while in their care.

All potential foster carers must agree to a health check and an enhanced Criminal Records Bureau check. There are many different types of fostering, including emergency, respite, short and long-term.

Meals on Wheels are at your service! They help to ensure people who cannot cook for themselves have a hot meal at least once a day.

In partnership with the WRVS, tasty two-course meals are delivered straight to the customer's home.

The meals can be delivered hot and ready to eat, or frozen to eat later. Fresh salads are also available on a daily basis.

A new menu includes meals such as beef stew and dumplings, salmon and broccoli bake, sliced turkey and stuffing, lemon sponge, Irish coffee cream and plum crumble. Meals can be tailored to suit diabetics and other special dietary needs.

People who are elderly, infirm, disabled or unwell can get Meals on Wheels.

WRVS volunteers not only deliver the food, they provide customers with social contact as many live alone and often do not have relatives and friends nearby to visit and help them out.

Volunteers also check customers are safe and well and can report back if they are worried or things do not seem right.

There are choices of meals every day and the two-course meal costs £3.30.

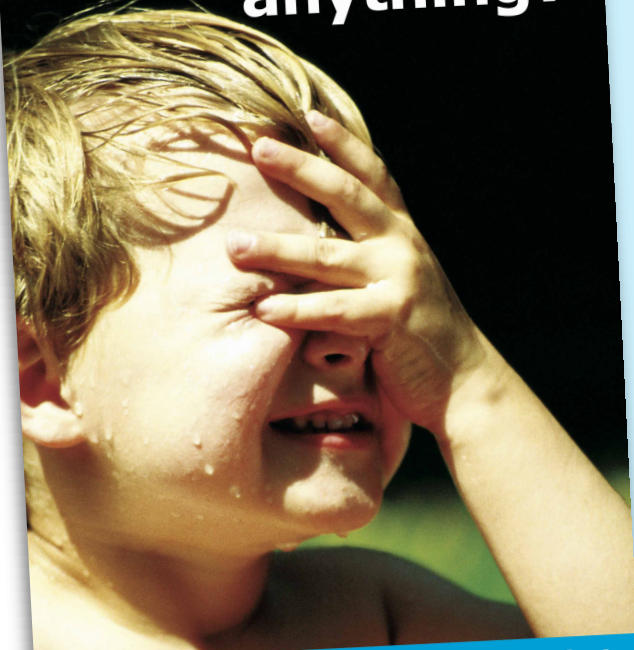

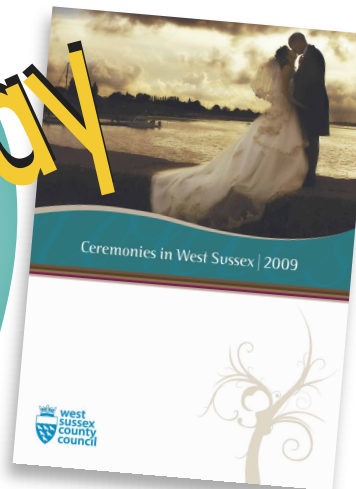

A new Discovery Area at Pagham Harbour has opened.

The aim was to create an area to show the public and schools how making small changes to a garden can have a big impact on wildlife.

A lottery grant has been used to renovate a pond and construct a wheelchair-accessible dipping platform, and create habitats for wildlife such as log piles for beetles and bugs, and rock piles for reptiles like lizards and slow-worms.

Willow arches and baskets have been made and installed, and an outdoor classroom for school visits created.

Sculptures have also been made for the area. One depicts a flock of birds flying and is made from recycled metal. The other has been carved from an oak log and reflects the history of Pagham, from its time as a landfill site to the reserve it is today, in a pair of hands.

We're 'Keeping West Sussex Working', that's the message from the County Council.

A total of £500,000 is being invested across the county in initiatives to help residents and businesses through the downturn.

Measures agreed so far include:

- ✓ £80,000 funding to Business Link Sussex to provide up to 240 business improvement reviews and support advice, to help businesses become as efficient as possible during the downturn.
- ✓ £100,000 of additional financial support for Citizens Advice Bureaux to help people who need debt counselling.
- ✓ £15,000 for West Sussex Libraries to provide IT training sessions and hundreds of new books advising people on employment and business, including CV writing, financial planning, how to start a business and job changing.

AT THE HEART OF THE COMMUNITY

Social enterprise businesses are helping to keep West Sussex working during these tough times.

Any profit generated is kept within the enterprise to fulfil their social objectives or to improve the business. They create local jobs, are environmentally-minded and benefit the local area.

The West Sussex Social Enterprise Network (WSSSEN) is championed by the County Council and works with organisations including Business Link and Action In Rural Sussex to promote and support social enterprise.

Social enterprise examples include

'Work this Way' which trains offenders at Ford Prison near Arundel to turn old cooking oil into bio-fuel for use in diesel vehicles. Another is the Aldingbourne Trust which offers training and employment opportunities to people with learning disabilities.

These are just two examples, but social enterprises provide a wide range of products and services from catering and crafts to recycling and training.

FREE ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTHCHECK FOR YOUR BUSINESS

Calling all businesses! Would you like a free environmental health check through the West Sussex Sustainable Business Partnership?

The Partnership helps local businesses to become more sustainable in their day-to-day working. The Partnership offers training and workshops and runs a technical helpline.

Another popular service is the free environmental review of waste disposal, water and energy use. An environmental audit will assess the business and then offer ways in which savings can be made.

The Partnership recently ran a Green Action Grants programme which enabled businesses to implement actions to save money and become greener. Successful businesses that have already won grants include:

- Wests of East Dean, which makes bespoke furniture, put a £500 grant towards the



cost of a biomass boiler to heat the workshop.

Waste wood and off-cuts will fire the boiler, which is expected to make £1,171 annual savings.

- The Mill House in Crawley, a pub and restaurant, applied for a £500 grant towards the cost of energy efficient lighting. It's expected to save the business at least £1,242 a year on electricity.

We are taking on 200 apprentices in the next two years, which will give opportunities in customer services, social care, administrative work and even in the Fire and Rescue Service.

It is hoped looked-after children who are cared for by the County Council will also apply to the scheme.

Ruth is pictured at a 'Grow Your Own' conference, which encourages young people to enter the business world, reading the West Sussex Connections edition which focussed on keeping West Sussex working.

Back to work

Finding work in these troubled times is difficult enough, but if you suffer from some kind of disability the task is twice as hard.

However, an initiative spearheaded by the County Council to find jobs for the hardest to help has proved an outstanding success.

Steps to Work helps people who have mental health needs, are recovering from drug and alcohol dependency, have a learning difficulty, have a physical or sensory impairment or who have an acquired brain injury.

In the last two years, in partnership with West Sussex Works, Southdown Housing (Breakaway), Sussex Partnership NHS Trust and the County Council, it has found permanent jobs for 165 people who fall into this category. A further 255 have found voluntary work or placements and 164 are achieving qualifications as a step towards finding full employment.

FREE West Sussex Green Club

Diverting Your Green Waste And Gardening Organically

West Sussex County Council in partnership with the District and Borough Councils and Viridor Waste Management Ltd have been running the West Sussex Green Club to help residents understand the need for greater awareness of how to deal with green waste and to promote a more organic approach to gardening.

Membership is free and open to anyone living in West Sussex. All you need to do is pledge a commitment to home compost, use the garden waste collection services and recycling facilities across the County as well as maintain a more organic approach to your horticultural activities.

Members receive quarterly newsletters packed full of tips. There is even a special club just for young budding gardeners: The "Green Diggers".

Most District and Borough Councils in West Sussex have a kerbside collection of recyclable material, including garden waste. By home composting and utilising the green waste collection scheme in your area or visiting your local Household Waste Recycling Site (HWRS) you can put your garden waste to good use. The garden waste is turned into organic soil conditioner that can now be purchased at your local HWRS except East Grinstead and Worthing as these sites are due to be upgraded. Once completed soil conditioner will be available to purchase at these sites also.

Turning garden waste into organic soil conditioner is an example of closing the loop by making waste a resource.

The Reclaim Organic Soil Conditioner is £4 a bag or 3 bags for £10!

Takes ALL food waste including meat, bones and dairy AND requires a minimum 30% garden waste. Best in the shade and does not require drainage, or digging into the soil.

Compost Converter:

Composters need a mix of green and brown materials including:

- ✓ Grass cuttings, young annual weeds and cut flowers
- ✓ Cabbage leaves, teabags and egg shells
- ✓ Seaweed and feathers
- ✓ Cardboard, hair and newspaper

Don't compost:

- ✗ Butter, oil, salad dressings
- ✗ Meat, bones, fish scraps
- ✗ Rose prunings or thorny branches
- ✗ Pet or human waste

Challenging Tasks

Steering a wheelchair around an obstacle course and making sandwiches with blurred glasses were just two of the strange tasks faced by teenagers from Chichester High School for Boys.

Occupational Therapist Emma Payne and her team set the challenges.

The aim was to reveal some of the problems people with disabilities face and how the service helps to solve them and enable people to remain living at home as independently as possible.

One of the tasks the boys were set was to imagine they had suffered a stroke resulting in a weakness down one side of the body. They were asked

to try to get in and out of a bath without any assistance. Then they tried the same manoeuvre with the help of a mechanical bath seat - which proved much easier and safer. The aim of the session was to show the boys how OTs help people overcome practical difficulties.

Emma hopes to encourage more young people - boys as well as girls - to consider OT as a career when they leave school.

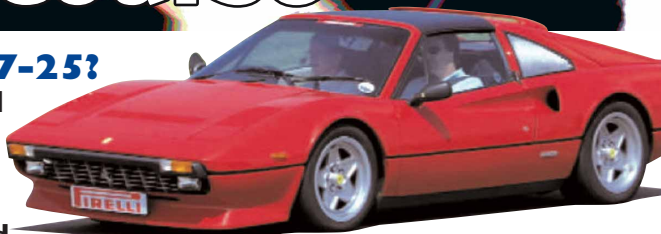

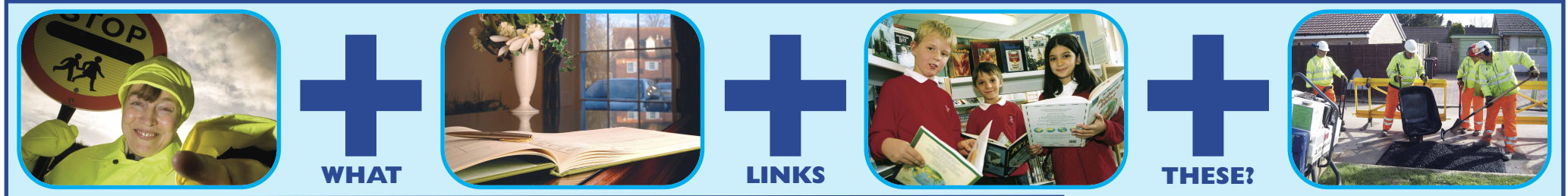


SAFE SUMMER

- Trendy, fun style sunglasses may not offer the protection children need, say our Trading Standards. They may not filter out the harmful UV light that can cause more damage to children's eyes than no glasses at all. Look out for the CE marking when buying sunglasses. Plastic lenses are better than glass ones because they are harder for children to break. Brown, amber and grey lenses and close-fitting, wrap-around sunglasses offer the best protection. Don't be fooled by the price - cheaper sunglasses are likely to offer the same, if not greater protection, than the more expensive pairs.
- Trading Standards can also provide advice on a variety of holiday problems ranging from the quality of your holiday accommodation to avoiding falling prey to timeshare holiday club touts. Ring Consumer Direct for advice on **08454 04 05 06**.
- Avoid dog-end danger and 'put it out, right out!', our firefighters are warning smokers. Smoking-related blazes are the UK's biggest killers in accidental home fires. As Jackie Boyle, Community Fire Safety Manager, said: "People shouldn't underestimate the dangers associated with smoking in the home if cigarettes aren't properly extinguished. The economic price of a house fire is immense and you can't put a cost on the lives of loved ones."

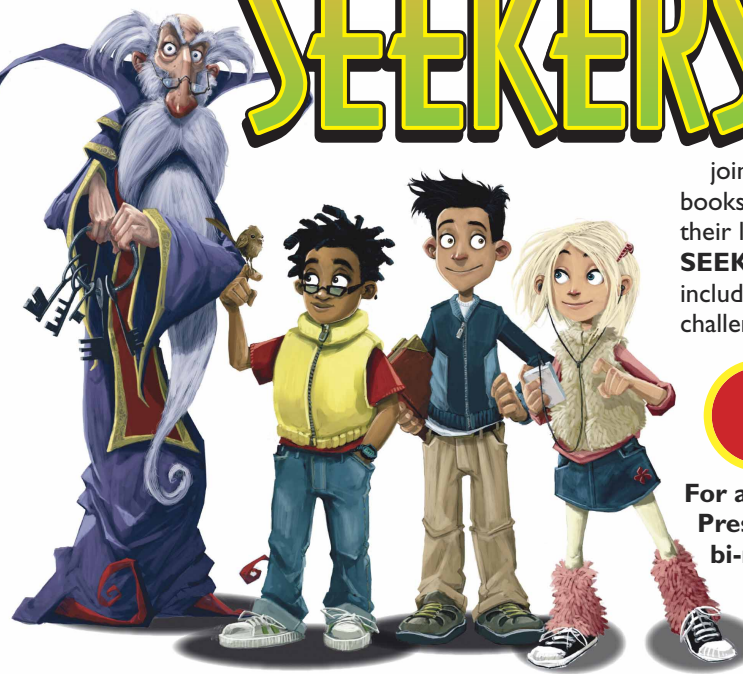

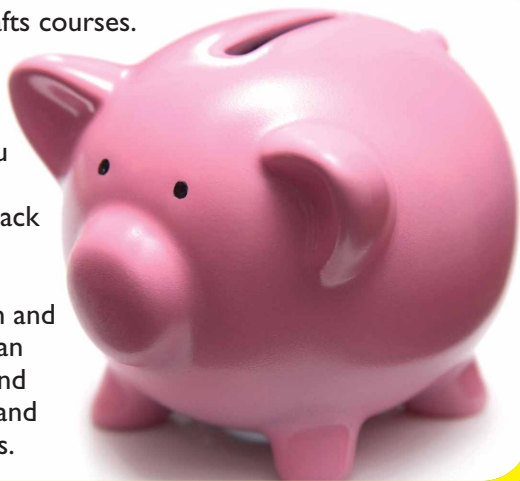
