Autumn rain has helped improve river flows slightly but unfortunately groundwater levels have not yet begun to rise. At present, the underground sources which provide 70 per cent of water supplies in the region remain seriously depleted.

If the recent rain continues we could expect levels to start to turn by the end of November 2006. However, if this winter turns out to be as dry as the previous one, levels will continue to fall well into the New Year. We anticipate that five months of above average rainfall is needed this winter for levels to return to normal.

The Young Drivers' Skills Course

After a short break, the Young Drivers' Skills Course re-started in August and is due to continue until March 2009. This innovative one-day course, held at Goodwood Motor Circuit near Chichester, is aimed at 17 to 25 year olds who hold a full driving licence and either live or drive regularly on the roads in West Sussex.

The course teaches some very important and potentially life-saving skills, including a practical on-road driving element with an Advanced Driving Instructor and practical training in skid-control on the Skid Pan at Goodwood. This particular age-group account for over 20% of all road traffic crashes; resulting in over 1,000 deaths every year in the UK. WSCC are aiming to help reduce this shocking statistic as part of the Public Service Agreement – if we can save just one life it will all have been completely worthwhile.

The course, which is greatly subsidised by WSCC costs just £60. We also offer the incentive of a drive in a Ferrari (to be taken on a separate day); this is available at an additional charge of only £60. Gift vouchers are available as this makes a fantastic present!

Launch Of Local Lifesaving Scheme Supported By Parish Council

Responder schemes have been successfully established in a number of locations in Sussex. These are groups of local residents who support the South East Coast Ambulance Service (SECAMB) NHS Trust by responding immediately to serious medical and other life-threatening conditions. A scheme to cover Steyning, Bramber and Upper Beeding was officially launched at Springwells Hotel, Steyning on Friday 1st September.

The first group of volunteers has already signed up and passed assessments made by SECAMB to become approved Community Responders. Joe Marshall from SECAMB said, 'we are, of course, still recruiting and there are very few people who cannot be trained'.

Martin Leigh-Pollitt, from Steyning & Henfield Rotary Club, sponsors of the scheme, reports that there has been a tremendous response to the publicity for funding required emergency kits used by the Responders. Money raised to date has enabled the Trust to buy six emergency packs, costing £2000 each, for the scheme. The main contributors have been:-

Steyning, Bramber and Upper Beeding Parish Councils; Steyning & Henfield Rotary Club; St Andrews Primary School; the Wilson Memorial Trust and the Georgemill Trust.

From enquiries, Martin has received he emphasises that the scheme is designed to support and not replace any of the emergency services offered by SECAMB. A call is made to 999 in the usual way and Responders can at the ambulance service's request attend the emergency, ensuring that treatment is available in the crucial minutes before the ambulance arrives, in some circumstances saving lives.

Although the scheme has got off to an excellent start, **it needs more Responders as well as donations or pledges of financial support**, either from individuals or from the business community. Amenities News

In my last report I mentioned Horsechestnut Bleeding Canker in a number of trees in Upper Beeding. Since then we have had a visit from Mark Warrick, an arboriculturist from West Sussex County Council. He gave us a glimmer of hope about the problem: It is likely that the disease is becoming more common because trees are stressed by drought. Therefore the wetter weather we have been having may enable them to become strong enough to recover from the disease. Lets hope the rain stays, it would be a pity to lose some of our most impressive trees.

I am also pleased to report that trees have been planted at thirteen selected sites in Beeding and Small Dole. The sites were identified by Mrs Steedman, our tree warden, and inspected by Mark Warrick on his visit. The costs are being subsidised by WSCC under their Trees for Shade scheme. We owe a vote of thanks to Mrs Steedman for her great commitment and to those who have volunteered to look after the new trees.

The Play Areas Refurbishment Project is continuing. The Amenities Committee examined the five tenders we received and eliminated three. There will be a public display and consultation in both Beeding and Small Dole and the children of Upper Beeding Primary School will have a chance to help choose some of the new equipment. With your help we will choose the final tender and then start looking for funding.

UBFC Golf Society

UBFC Golf Society is based at the Kings Head public house in the High Street, Upper Beeding and has around thirty members who regularly thrash around golf courses at home and abroad, presumably searching for as yet undiscovered forms of flora and fauna.

We organise a round of golf on most Sundays and a weekday Society day about once each month. Sundays can see anywhere from six to sixteen go out locally to Hill Barn, Singing Hills, West Hove, Rookwood, Slinfold Park, Hassocks, Hollingbury, Rusper, Tilgate Forest, Mid Sussex, West Chiltington or the Surrey National. In addition to these courses we have held Society Days at East Sussex National, the Dyke, Littlehampton, Ham Manor, Worthing, the Kent National (Moatlands), Lewes and Cottesmore Golf Clubs.

The Society was created when a bunch of footballers from the village got too old to run around and had to find a way to stay out of the pub. We failed miserably to stay out of the pub, but at least we get some exercise. Handicaps range from single figures to the maximum, and the age range is currently early twenties to fifty something.

We are also dedicated to raising money for good causes locally and over the last few years have provided an electric wheelchair for a young man from Bramber and a motorised "tricycle" style wheelchair attachment to allow a Steyning woman the independence to shop or roam on her own.

Our yearly highlight is the "Schneider Cup" which is played over three days and three courses in Ryder Cup format (foursomes, fourballs and singles) between teams led by the Society Captain and the Vice Captain. So far the Schneider Cup has been played for in Normandy (Granville), Lisbon (the Aroera Complex - twice) and Marbella (Mihás, La Cala, Rio Real). We don't do cold, we don't do wet!

For the past couple of years, small bands of the Society have travelled further a field, with a January break to the gulf coast of Florida, where seven rounds of golf were played on seven different courses over 10 days. Next year the "over the pond" trip has been delayed until May as the "Players Championship" at Sawgrass will be held in that month and we'll be going to watch. We'll be playing the likes of Heron Creek, Bobby Jones, The Preserve, The Legacy, University Parkway and the Magnificent Waterleafe which is cut through the Manatee river.

If there's any one out there who fancies a game we'll be in the pub. Just ask for Chris.

History Of Beeding 4 - Relics from Burial Mounds.

The last two articles have both mentioned burial mounds (also known as barrows or tumuli) and their contents. Today, when archaeologists get the opportunity to carefully excavate such sites, they record the contents and preserve them for further study, or for display in museums where we can all see them.

The following two announcements show what happened in the past. They were originally published in the Sussex Weekly Advertiser in 1800 and reprinted in Volume 30, No 3, of the Sussex County Magazine in 1956:

March 17th 1800: Antique Urns etc - CHARLES BEST, Shepherd, at the foot of Beeding Hill, respectfully informs the Public that the urns, and other relics of antiquity, taken out of a tumulus on the Downs by him, (and lately in the possession of the Rev. Dr. Hutchinson) have been restored to him, and are now in his cottage, at the foot of Beeding Hill aforesaid, for the inspection of the curious. NB The above curiosities are to be shortly sold to the highest bidder.

March 24th 1800: Further Finds on Beeding Hill - The shepherd who lately dug up the Roman urns etc on Beeding Hill, has almost ever since employed his time in opening fresh tumuli, in some of which he discovered fire-places formed of flints, with heaps of mussel-shells piled near them; and in others, human skeletons, one of which was evidently of some person who had been decapitated before interment, as the skull was found lying between the thigh bones. This, which is quite complete, is now in the possession of Mr Weeks, Surgeon, of Hurst, who has threaded the vertebrae, and placed the skull in its proper situation. In one of the tumuli were found two skeletons, lying one upon the other, with almost six inches of earth between them.

Unfortunately it is not known where these items are now. There is no record either of where Charles Best lived "at the foot of Beeding Hill" as he is not recorded in any census of the village.

Tot the ancient god of journeys

Is there something more to the name of Tottington Wood than was first thought?

Did you know that in Kent, not far from Canterbury lies 'the Coffin Stone'? It is a large sarsen stone. In 1836 several human remains were found there. The Druids used to set up solitary stones in honour of Tot, and this particular monument lies in a field known as Tot Field at Tottington – mentioned in the Domesday Book.

Close by this field at Tottington there used to be a manor surrounded by a deep moat, and nearby is the Pilgrim's Way and Boxley Abbey. So, is there anything exciting lurking in our Tottington Wood? (Or is it just Woodlanders up to mischief on winter work days?)

Thanks to Francis Gilbert who wrote this article after reading about the Coffin Stone in a leaflet about Medway crop circles. If anyone knows any more details please send in your findings and perhaps we'll a little more about the name Tottington.
